Biography

Professor Bruno Lunenfeld born in Vienna 1927, was the first to study and assess the combination of testosterone and estrogens in the menopausal syndrome for his medical thesis in 1954. He was the first to develop the clinical use of human menopausal gonadotropins; was instrumental in the creation of the international standard for gonadotropins, the classification of infertile patients as well as the ovarian hyperstimulation syndrome. He has also made significant contributions to the understanding of follicular recruitment, rescue, selection, growth and development, the ovulatory cycle and the mechanism of action of gonadotropins in ovaries and testis. Professor Lunenfeld has been a driving force in studies of the aging male, was the Founder and first President of the International Society for the study of the aging male, and Editor of the *The Aging Male*.

Professor Lunenfeld is the co-founder of ASPIRE, was nominated Fellow (ad eundem) of the Royal College of Obstetrics and Gynecologists (UK) and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. In 1995, he became honorary member of the European Society of Human Reproduction and Embryology and the International Federation of Fertility Societies.
